#### GRUTA DO CARVÃO



Nestled in the western corner of Ponta Delgada city is the magnificent Gruta do Carvão, the grandest lava tunnel on São Miguel island. Stretching a whopping 1912 meters, this underground wonderland is split into three thrilling sections. It was classified as a Natural Monument of the Azores by the Regional Government in May 2005 and is a popular attraction. It can be a great rainy day activitiy, just make sure you call/email ahead to book!

### POÇO AZUL TRAIL

Explore the vast grounds showcasing native plants, caves, and ponds. At the heart of it all, stands an ancient tree that seems right out of a fairy tale. With plenty of shade to offer, the Jardim Antonio Borges is a perfect retreat on a sunny Portuguese afternoon.

#### PRIOLO ENVIRONMENTAL CENTER





Sao Miguel Island is the only habitat for the Azores Bullfinch (locally known Priolo). One of the most threatened birds in Europe and only found on the east of the island, this centre is dedicated to raising awareness and contributing to conservation. A great day out for nature and wildlife lovers, set in a beautiful location with knowledgable guides and a chance to see these rare birds in their natural habitat.

#### FURNAS MONITORING AND RESEARCH CENTRE

If you are heading over to Furnas and would like to know more about the fascinating geothermal volcanic history of the Azores then this research centre is worth a quick stop off. The entrance fee is 3€ - guided tours begin on the hour and last around thirty-minutes. Learn about the history and ongoing eco projects focused on conservation of this magical land. After your visit you can explore the lake and botanical gardens nearby.







#### MOSTEIROS BEACH



To truly experience an Azorean beach, this particular one is a mustvisit. Renowned as one of the most stunning sunset locations on the entire island, this black sand beach is also celebrated for its rugged charm, nestled among volcanic rocks and cliffs, making it an ideal destination for a leisurely afternoon with a picnic.

#### PONTA DA FERRARIA

Feeling adventurous? Take a drive to Ponta da Ferraria, home to a therapeutic hot water pool beloved by locals since the 15th century. This unique pool is distinct as it sits in the ocean, warmed by an underwater volcanic vent current. Surrounded by striking cliffs and black volcanic rock formations, this free-to-visit spot offers a one-ofa-kind experience. Just a heads up, the road to Ferraria is not for the faint-hearted!



#### FORT OF SÃO BRÁS

Forte de São Brás in Ponta Delgada is a military fort by the sea, built in the 16th century and expanded in the 18-19th centuries. It houses the Azores Military Museum, showcasing WWII machinery, weapons, uniforms, and authentic tunnels. Visitors can explore the outside walls for free or pay a small fee to enter the museum for a historical experience.


